## 2 DID YOU KNOW ..?

### TALE N°1

#### **The Three Little Pigs**

(anglo-saxon tale, published for the first time in 1843 in Nursery Rhymes and Nursery Tales by James Halliwell).

### TALE N°2

#### Rapunzel

(popular German tale that was included by the Brothers Grimm in the first volume of Children's and Household Tales).

## TALE N°3

#### The Big Bad Wolf

(traditional character that appears in multiple folklore tellings, including Aesop's Fables and Grimms' Fairy Tales, and that also inspired Disney Studio's Big Bad Wolf character in 1933).

## TALE N°4

#### The Pied Piper of Hamelin

(German legend transcribed notably by the Brothers Grimm and known by the original title Der Rattenfänger von Hameln).

## TALE N°5

#### The Hen That Laid the Golden Eggs

(fable by Jean de la Fontaine, published in the first collection of La Fontaine's Fables).

### TALE N°6

#### Jack and the Magic Beanstalk

(popular English tale with multiple versions written in the middle of the 18th century).
